Teaching Tip #1: I encourage you to allow your students to create their own rules, however I included some for each subject in case you need to start students off with example.

Teaching Tip #2: To add rigor, choose more subjective rules or rules that include the center "overlap" section (ex. Positive Connotation, Negative Connotation, Could be both depending on how it's used). To lower the rigor, eliminate the overlap and have students sort into two categories.
